Rotary clubs are non-religious, non-governmental and open to every race, culture and creed. Club membership represents a cross-section of local community business and professional leaders.



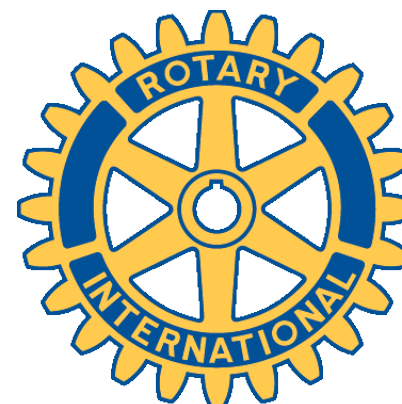

Expectations

Club Dues

Annual dues are \$196 payable in two installments via a direct billing.

Additional Financial Obligations

Members are expected to contribute or sell an annual allotment of breakfast tickets for our primary fundraiser, held at Jefferson High School in March each year. The proceeds from this event are used to fund our scholarship fund and annual gifts to area charitable organizations. Weekly meal costs are paid by each member. A direct billing pre-pay program is available. Incidental "fines" may be assessed at times in a humorous way that benefits our scholarship recipients.

Attendance Expectations

Members are required to attend 50% of weekly Rotary meetings to be in good standing. There are many opportunities in the immediate area to "make-up" missed meetings. Area meeting locations are detailed on the website at www.cwestrotary.org.

Active Committee Involvement

Each member is asked to serve on at least one committee to support the organization. Committees provide a great way to get involved and get to know others in the club and community.

Following a general introduction to the membership, you will be presented with a red badge. This red badge helps others identify you as a newer member and to welcome you to West. After a six-month period and achieving at least a 50% attendance rating at weekly meetings, the red badge is exchanged for a blue badge. In addition, an orientation program to learn about Rotary International must be completed. During this time you may also be asked to act as a "greeter" or check-in members as a way to get to know others in West.
